Thankful for What?

In 1 Thessalonians 5:15-18, Paul writes the following charge to the church gathered in Thessalonica:

See that none of you repays evil for evil, but always seek to do good to one another and to all. Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you.

Give thanks in <u>all</u> circumstances ... really, Paul? Why don't you just tell us to count the grains of sand on the beach or number the stars in the sky? Those things seem more doable than what we are charged to do in this passage.

Giving thanks for the good things that happen to us and the good things given to us is easy. We could probably list at least three things that we are thankful for just off the top of our heads. I encourage you to pause your reading here and think of, or write down those things that just popped into your head when you thought of the people and things for which you are thankful, and then say a quick prayer of thanksgiving for them. You probably thought about family, friends, church, and material blessings. But how many of you thought about things like dirty dishes, piles of laundry, and utility bills? I know I didn't until Sunday.

During the Minute for Mission on January 22nd, Lindalee Walters read the following from a meditation written by Sue Mummert in honor of Presbyterian Women's Thank Offering:

So, what are you thankful for today? Family? Friends? Faith? You probably can write out a long list. But what about dirty dishes? Consider them a remembrance of having food on the table. Dirty laundry? They point to your blessing of clothes to wear. Pile of utility bills?

They show that you have a home to care for, a place to rest your head in safety.

To be honest, I hadn't thought about the huge mountain of clothes piled in the corner of our bedroom waiting to be washed as a blessing. I hadn't thought about dirty dishes as something to be thankful for. I haven't looked at a power bill and been grateful. Yet, in all these things we are blessed.

What would it look like in our lives if we went to the mailbox, saw the utility bill waiting for us, and gave God a big thank you for it (no matter what we owe)? What would it look like in our lives if we put our clothes in the washing machine with a quick, *Thank you, God, for the blessing of clothes to wear*? What if we looked in our fridge and saw our leftovers as a sign of God's overabundance and goodness toward us? Maybe, if we did, then we would be able to live Paul's charge and be thankful in **ALL** circumstances.

Being thankful in ALL circumstances means seeing God's blessings all around us, even in the most unlikely of places. Where do you see God's blessing right now? May we all have eyes to see God's blessings in the most unusual places and tongues to speak our thanks to the one and only God who gives us blessings in all circumstances.

Lent is . . .

Lent begins on February 22nd, with Ash Wednesday, as a day of



mourning for our sin and the sins of all humanity before God, a recognition of our mortality save for the grace of God and a request that the Lord remember our creation and breathe new life into our burned-out, dusty lives once more.

The season of Lent is a time of prayer, fasting and self-examination in preparation for the celebration of the resurrection of the Lord at Easter. It is a period of 40 days, like the flood of Genesis, Moses' sojourn at Mount Sinai, Elijah's journey to Mount Horeb, Jonah's call to Ninevah to repent, and Jesus' time of testing in the wilderness. (The Sundays in Lent are not counted in this reckoning of the time between Ash Wednesday and Easter, as every Lord's Day is a celebration of the resurrection of Jesus Christ.)




During the past year we'd send


KNIT'n'STITCH




What does this logo mean?

How many times do we see a logo and just accept it as a logo but not really analyze the meaning of its parts? Designers may spend days to months to design a logo for an organization or company, so that become synonymous and easily recognized as that organization or company.

Upon the establishment of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) in 1983, the General Assembly commissioned graphic artist Malcolm Grear to create a church

seal that would honor the historic symbols of the Reformed tradition, and also provide a fresh new symbol to represent the new PC(USA). Since its adoption in 1985, the seal has been widely accepted across the church and used in a variety of ways and on many different objects, from church bulletins and signs to needlework, ties, and jackets. In fact, it may be so familiar that we no longer really see the symbol for what it is.

The following picture should explain all those parts.

- February is mostly recognized for Valentine's Day, flowers, and, depending on where you are, being incredibly cold!
- Oddly enough, even though it's just another month, there's a lot of history behind this month of romance and **love**!
- For those born in February, your birthstone is an amethyst, and your flower is a primrose. The western zodiac signs in February are Aquarius which is until February 19th, and Pisces, which starts February 20th.
- The length of February was finalized when Julius Caesar remade the Roman calendar and assigned the month 28 days and 29 days. In 713 B.C., February was officially added to the Roman calendar. Over time, the length of February kept changing. At one point, it had as little as 23 days.
- In the Northern Hemisphere, February is the third month of winter. Meanwhile, in the Southern Hemisphere, February is the last month of summer. Between the Northern and Southern Hemispheres, February is the equivalent of August.
- The name of February comes from the Latin word "februum," which means purification. February was named after a purification ritual which was like an early Roman spring cleaning festival. In Welsh, February is sometimes known as "y mis bach," which means "little month."
- The Saxons called February "Solmonath" which means "cake month," because they would offer cakes to the gods during the month of February.

- February and January were two months added to the Roman numeral calendar.
- Of all the words you can misspell, February is one of the most misspelled words in the English language. Even the White House has misprinted the word "February" before in a press release!
- February is the only month where it's possible to go the entire time without having a full moon.
- February has been **Black History Month** for over 40 years.
- The odds of being born on February 29th are about 1 in 1,461. Those born on a leap day can be called a "leaper" or "leapling."
- February, March, and November always start on the same day of the week unless it is a leap year.
- It was in February, 1964, when The Beatles made their first American television appearance on the "Ed Sullivan Show." Over 73 million Americans watched!
- There are many U.S. states that entered the Union during the month of February; these include Massachusetts, Oregon, Arizona, and Mississippi.
- Sadly, on February 1, 2003, the Space Shuttle "Columbia" broke apart in flight, which killed all seven crew members. The accident was believed to be a result of damage that occurred during lift-off. The tragedy occurred only 16 minutes before the shuttle was scheduled to land.
- On February 2, 1848, U.S. and Mexico signed the Treaty of Guadalupe Hidalgo, which ended their war. The U.S. paid Mexico \$15 million in exchange for California, Nevada, Utah, Arizona, New Mexico, Colorado, Wyoming, and Texas.


