Picture it, Cleveland, GA 2023. Jesus and Me...

I love the 80's sitcom *The Golden Girls*, the TV show which began in 1985 and ran for seven seasons. It tells the stories of four older adult women living together in Miami, the stories of their loves, losses, and friendship. One of my favorite characters on the show is Sophia Petrillo. Sophia is the oldest woman in the house. An immigrant from Sicily, Sophia frequently shares her Old-World wisdom with the other women in the house. When she does, she always begins her stories with the words "Picture it," which is usually followed by Sicily or New York and the year that the story takes place: "Picture it, Sicily, 1915..." Now, how many of Sophia's stories are true is up for debate, but the point is that she told the stories.

We all have stories that we tell: the story of how we met our spouse; the stories of our children's births; the stories of the strange and funny things we encounter every day; and the stories of our travels, and the food we ate on those travels, just to name a few examples. We tell these stories to anyone who will listen. We tell them multiple times to multiple people because they matter to us. Yet the most important story of our lives we keep to ourselves. How often do we tell the story of when we first responded to God's love by letting go and following him? How often do we tell the story of those times when Jesus found us in our darkest places and lifted us up? How often do we tell the story of the good things God has done for us and our deep and profound gratitude to him? More than likely, we tell these stories less than we tell the story of that great fish restaurant that we found on our honeymoon.

Why do we not share the most important stories of our lives, the stories of our moments with God, with others? Some of us get intimidated by the idea of sharing our faith. We think that in order to share our faith with someone then we need to be able to answer all the questions that they may possibly have about Jesus, God, faith, and the church. Others of us are afraid that someone might





get angry with us for sharing our faith with them, and we're not sure we can bear their anger. At the end of the day, some of us are simply, "evangelistically awkward." We don't know what to say or how to say it, so we just keep these very important stories to ourselves.

Sharing our faith is all about sharing a story, the story of Jesus and us. It's just like the stories that we share about vacation meals and children's antics, but this time the topic is "what God did for me today." You don't have to have a script or memorize lines to share the good news; you don't have to begin your story with "Picture it, Cleveland, Georgia, 2023...Jesus and Me..." Just work it into the conversation. It can be as simple as telling someone what you are thankful for today or as complex as the story of the day you and Jesus became more than acquaintances. It's your story to share. Share it because there are many people who need to hear it more than the story about your wedding, your children, or your trip to Myrtle Beach. You have nothing to lose by sharing your story, but your listener has everything to gain. So, share the story God has given you. It's the most important one you have.



A is for Affrilachia

While this month we celebrate Easter, I want to go back

to February and acknowledge Black History Month and a new term I learned, *Affrilachia*. I discovered it in a press release about an art exhibit of Affrilachian art at the Stephens County Library and a gallery in Toccoa. I consider myself pretty knowledgeable about words but I confess I thought this term was new. To my surprise I discovered that, according to Wikipedia, Frank X. Walker, an African-American poet from Danville, Kentucky, coined the term *Affrilachia* in the 1990's.

Walker wanted to ensure that the voices and accomplishments of African-American writers, poets, and artists in that region were recognized. He wrote a book for children titled *A is for Affrilachia*, which features from A to Z a wide range of musicians, artists, and writers, as well as mountain ranges, literary works, and coal mining implements. I think adults would enjoy it, too.



Also, during February Linda Erbele, wrote a wonderful article about White County's black history, entitled "It's Amazing." It appeared in the February 16th edition of The White County News. If you missed it, stop by the paper and pick up a back issue or go to the paper's online archives. It's well worth the effort to

see the beautiful local photos by award-winning photo journalist Chris Aluka Berry, and read about the historic Rock Springs camp meeting grounds built in White County in the 1800s by and for formerly enslaved individuals.

The article has real-life experiences related by Annie Sutton who said she's attended the Rock Springs camp meeting all her life. Annie is the first African-American woman to be elected in the City of Cleveland, winning the Ward 2 Council Seat in 2000; she later resigned to run for Mayor. I was honored to meet her and listen as she talked about her memories growing-up in the area.

There's always something new to learn. If you're interested in finding out more about White County's camp meeting grounds or Affrilachia, visit The White County Historical Society on the Square in Cleveland or the White County Library in Cleveland or Helen.

We appreciate your efforts to control these costs.


Concerts on the Hill Features Rachel Ficklin



Maundy Thursday: A Time to Remember

Worship during Holy Week helps us to focus on the joyful, tender, and harrowing events that led to Jesus's death and resurrection. *Come to the Cross and Remember,* the cantata to be presented by the FPC choir at 7:00 p.m., on Thursday, April 6th, reminds us of these events through song and imagery.



The Maundy Thursday service also will include communion and a Tenebrae observance during which

the sanctuary is gradually darkened. The congregation leaves the church in silence.

The cantata will be directed by David Arvold, and the FPC choir will be accompanied by an instrumental ensemble, and James Geiger on the keyboard. During interludes of singing and narration, symbols will be laid before a cross in the front of the sanctuary:


- Palm branches: the entry into Jerusalem
- The cup and the bread: the Last Supper
- ⊕ Flowers: the Garden of Gethsemane
- Thirty coins: Judas's betrayal of Jesus
- A torch: the arrest in the garden
- A crown of thorns: humiliation and mocking of Jesus
- Nails: the cruel execution
- A shroud: the burial in a tomb



Congratulations to Judy Winski who was elected to serve as Treasurer in Training. She will become the Treasurer for the group beginning March 2024 for a 3-year term.


We were able to display and sell our knit and stitch wares.





We never know what even a small gesture like that can do.


