What Do You Take on a Pilgrimage?

The Canterbury Tales—General Prologue

by Geoffrey Chaucer (1343-1400)

Translated by Evan Mantyk

When April's sweetest showers downward shoot,
The drought of March is pierced right to the root
Through every vein with liquid of such power
And virtue that it generates the flower;
When Zephyrus too exhales his breath so sweet
Inspiring in ground beneath the feet
The tender crops, and there's a youthful sun,
His second half course through the Ram now run,
And little birds start making melodies
Who sleep all night eyes open in the trees
(For Nature pricks them in each little heart),
On pilgrimage then folks desire to start.
The palmers seek to make their travel plans
For far-off shrines renowned in sundry lands.

As I prepare for my own pilgrimage, I find myself thinking of these words from the General Prologue of Geoffrey Chaucer's *The Canterbury Tales*. *The Canterbury Tales* tells the stories of a motley crew of pilgrims traveling to Canterbury Cathedral to view and venerate the relics of St. Thomas à Beckett. They leave in April when as Chaucer writes "The palmers seek to make their travel plans for far-off shrines renowned in sundry lands." Maybe these words resonate because I too am starting my pilgrimage to "far-off shrines" in April. What is it about the Spring that makes us want to go on adventures, to go on pilgrimages to seek God and possibly find him? Maybe, it is because spring is the time of renewal. The time when life comes again after the winter. Maybe, deep down in our primal souls we too feel the need for resurrection, the need to feel alive after the dark of winter, the need to have our own faith brought to life again.

This weekend I have spent much time pondering the question of what to bring on my April pilgrimage. Of course, I will bring clothes. I will bring my medicine, my toiletries, my passport, and my extra pair of glasses (since I am blind as a bat without them). I will bring a book (or two) to read, a tablet to watch movies on while I fly, and my cell phone for pictures. But what else should I bring?

Should I bring my expectations of holy moments and meeting God? What if my expectations of this pilgrimage are not met?

Should I bring my fears and anxieties, or should I hide them somewhere deep in the luggage?

Should I bring my longings for a deeper relationship with God, for communion with him, for a real sense of his presence?

In all my pondering, the only thing I think I have figured out is that the best thing I can bring on my pilgrimage is myself, ALL of myself with all my goofiness, my fear, my hopes, my anxieties, my joy, my wonder, and my openness to whatever God has in store.

That is the best that any of us can bring to our spring pilgrimages. Whether we are going to Scotland or up the street, whether our pilgrimage is a physical one, or one of the heart, the only thing, the best thing, we can bring is ourselves, open and willing to hear what God has to say, to see what he would have us to see, and to enjoy his presence all along the way.

when we cannot attend in person. But before that can happen, hours of preparation are done.

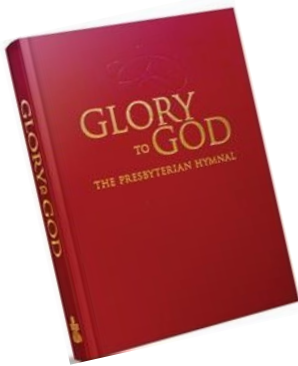
Kim Ciriello has been doing this for several years, and during the pandemic, it was a life-saver for many. Then, when the service

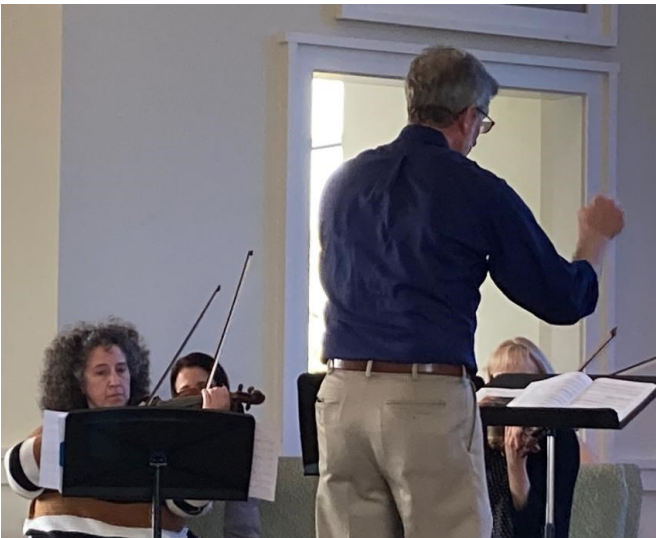

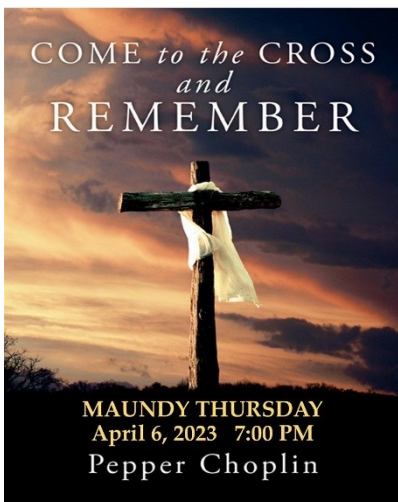

"Hold the shroud in your hands, and . . . Remember."



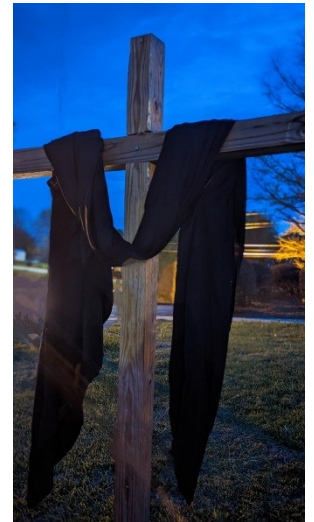

From stage to film: Fourth grader films TV pilot

While most elementary school students are dreaming of what they want to be when they grow up, Josalynne Wiley is acting on those dreams.

She's performed on the White County High School stage three times, been in an ABC Family Channel commercial, and even appeared as a background character in an episode of "Wild 'n Out."

"I love being on stage, but I have been out in different places I've never been before," Josalynne said.

Last week, her dream took her to Los Angeles, where she filmed a pilot for a television show. It will take about six months to the editing process before they even find out if the pilot is picked up by a network, and if there's a possibility for more appearances.

It wasn't a full-on role — meaning she had lines and her face was on the screen at times — she will get an account on Internet Movie Database, or IMDb.

"That's where a lot of casting agencies will look to find talent, so we're pretty excited about that," her mom, Annette, said.

Josalynne is used to waiting — it's usually a long time between the time she auditioned for a role and knows whether or not she got it.

She and her family have a saying: "Fins in and fins out."

Her favorite project she auditioned for was "Spider and His Amazing Friends."

There have been tough — some roles are very specific in how the actor should look. She was two inches too tall to play one character.

"It's very stressful," Josalynne said. One thing that hasn't been stressful is keeping up with her schoolwork. She said it's getting to be easier to balance school work now.

Plus, her teacher and principal at Treasure Gap Elementary have been very supportive, using notes learned during the pandemic.

Josalynne got her start about five years ago on stage as "The Boy Next Door."

Her father, Adam, has been active in the high school's theater program, and her brother, Sebastian, is also an actor both professionally and at the high school.

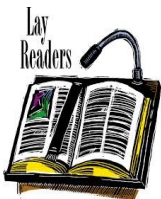
