# New Shoes, New Clothes, New You

We like new things: new shoes, purses, and clothes in our closets. We like new carpet on our floors, curtains on our windows, and paint on our walls. We even buy car fresheners that promise to make our twenty-year-old cars smell like they just came brand new from the factory. We try out new TV shows and dabble in new activities. We try new recipes. We hear new ideas and even embrace those new ideas, sometimes. We like new. New is better. New is innovative. New is cutting edge. New is exciting except when it comes to us being made new.

Being made new is exciting to some and terrifying to others. We don't know what being made new will entail or where it will lead; it may even make us a little defensive wondering "What's wrong with the old me that I need to be made new?" Whether we think it is exciting, frightening, or unnecessary, the truth is that we are all in the process of being made new creations in Christ. The Scriptures tell us that we, who have seen the face of Christ in our life and who believe in him as Lord and Savior, are being made new every day, changed by the Holy Spirit to look more and more like Christ. Paul writes in his second letter to the Corinthians, "So all of us who have had that veil removed can see and reflect the glory of the Lord. And the Lord, who is the Spirit, makes us more and more like him as we are changed into his glorious image." (2 Corinthians 3:18, New Living Translation) Did you read what I read in that passage? We are being made more and more like Christ, being changed into his "glorious image."

I don't know about y'all, but I don't want to wake up in the morning and be the same person I was the day before. I want to wake up and know that today I am a little more like my Savior. My goal, as a disciple of Jesus Christ and a child of my heavenly Father, is to become more and more like Jesus in my thinking and in my living. I want to wake up knowing that the Spirit is working within me (by no good deed of my own) to change me in order that I might

become the person God is calling me to be, a person who mirrors his Son. Do I think that I will wake up one morning with a halo over my head, and somehow I will be holy, good, and perfect in all things Christian? NO! I know that I'm going to mess things up. I know that I'm going to say the wrong thing, think the wrong thing, or act the wrong way. However, I also know that the Spirit will be speaking to me, in her still, small voice, to point me in the right direction and move me toward becoming whom Christ has made me to be, a new creation who can rest in the promise that my sins are forgiven and that God's grace is working in my life.

And my brothers and sisters, what is true for us as individuals is true for us as a community of believers. Our church is being made new, being transformed more and more into the likeness of Christ and into whom Jesus is calling us to be. Who wants a church that is the same as it was yesterday? We need a church that is willing to be made new, to be changed into the likeness of Jesus Christ so that it might be the hands, feet, and heart of Jesus in our community and our world.

# Labor Day

Labor Day has been a national holiday since 1894, when President Grover Cleveland signed the law that Congress passed designating the first Monday in September to be a holiday for workers. The workers' unions chose the first Monday in September because it was halfway between Independence Day and Thanksgiving. At the time, people worked an average of 60 hours a week and unions pressed for shorter workweeks, more paid days off, and to gain recognition of both the contributions and the mistreatment of workers at the time.


We also have <u>Specialty cards</u> that are packages just for Birthday, Get Well, Sympathy, or All Occasion, each with corresponding messages.







# September's History in a Nutshell

**September 2, 1666** - The Great Fire of London began in a bakery. More than 13,000 houses were destroyed, but only six lives were lost.

**September 2, 1752** - The British ended their use of the Julian calendar, switching instead to the Gregorian calendar, resulting in a major adjustment as Wednesday, September 2, was followed by Thursday, September 14. This caused rioting by people who felt cheated and demanded the missing eleven days back.

**September 2, 1789** - The U.S. Treasury, was established by Congress.

**September 2, 1945** - President Harry Truman declared V-J Day. **September 2, 1962** - Cuba Missile Crisis.

**September 3, 1783** - The Treaty of Paris was signed ending the American Revolutionary War between Britain and the United States.

**September 4, 1609** - The island of Manhattan was discovered by navigator Henry Hudson.

**September 4, 1886** - The last major U.S.-Indian war came to an end as Geronimo was captured.

**September 8, 1900** - A hurricane struck Galveston, TX, killing over 8,000 persons, making it the worst natural disaster in U.S. history.

**September 11, 2001** - The worst terrorist attack in U.S. history occurred.

**September 13, 1788** - New York became the Federal capital of the new American government.

**September 14, 1741** - Composer George Frederick Handel finished *Messiah* after working on it nonstop for 23 days.

**September 15, 1916** - Tanks were first used in combat, in World War I.

**September 16, 1620** - The *Mayflower* ship departed from England, bound for America with 102 passengers and a small crew.

**September 16, 1908 -** General Motors was founded.

**September 16, 1976** - The Episcopalian Church in the U.S. approved the ordination of women priests and bishops.

**September 17, 1787** - The proposed U.S. Constitution was approved.

September 17, 1862 - Battle at Antietam.

**September 18, 1947** - The U.S. Air Force was established as a separate military service.

**September 19, 1893** - New Zealand became the first country to grant women the right to vote.

**September 20, 1873** - The New York Stock Exchange was forced to close for the first time in its history, resulting in a banking crisis during the financial Panic of 1873.

**September 22, 1862** - President Abraham Lincoln issued a preliminary Emancipation Proclamation freeing the slaves in territories held by Confederates as of January 1, 1863.

**September 25, 1789** - The first U.S. Congress proposed 12 Amendments to the Constitution, ten of which, comprising the Bill of Rights, were ratified.

**September 26, 1960** - The first-ever televised presidential debate occurred between presidential candidates John F. Kennedy and Richard M. Nixon.

**September 29, 1789** - Congress created the United States Army, consisting of 1,000 enlisted men and officers.

**September 29, 1829** - Britain's "bobbies" made their first public appearance. Greater London's Metropolitan Police force was established by an act of Parliament. The force later became known as Scotland Yard.

**September 30, 1955** - Actor James Dean was killed in a car crash in California at age 24. Although he made just three major films, *Rebel Without a Cause, East of Eden* and *Giant*, he remains one of the most influential actors.
